Description

Tall stocks with bright jaw-like blooms
Ferny plants with yellow, gold, orange or brownish maroon flowers
Funnel-shaped flowers of many colors
Low trailing clusters of tiny white, purple, or pink flowers
Pointy, dark green foliage with bright carnation-like flowers.
Small, low-growing tubular-lipped flower of vibrant blue, purple, pink or white
Loose clusters of sensitive flowers in pink, red, lilac, coral, or white

Description

Annual Phlox

Phlox Drummondii

Wide hairy leaves with clusters of blossoms at tops of stocks in many colors

California Poppy

Eschscholzia

Bright orange poppy-like flowers

Cockscomb

Celosia

Feather-like or clustery brain-like fuzzy flowers in rich, vibrant colors

Floss Flower

Ageratum

Blue clusters of powder puff flowers

Globe Amaranth

Gopher

Small hot pink globe flowers on low growing plants

Marigold

Tagetes

Ferny plants with yellow, gold, orange or brownish maroon flowers

Lobelia

Lobelia

Small, low-growing tubular-lipped flower of vibrant blue, purple, pink or white. Can't tolerate much sun.

Pincushion Flower

Scabiosa

Multifaceted round purple flowers on tall thin stocks above clumpy plants

Pinks

Dianthus

Pointy, dark green foliage with bright carnation-like flowers.

Snap Dragon

Antirrhinum

Tall stocks with bright jaw-like blooms

Star Clusters

Pentas lanceolata

Tight four-inch clusters of small, star-shaped flowers in white, pink, lilac, or red. Cluster sits atop deep green clusters of foliage.

Statice

Limonium

Large green basal leaves with airy clusters of tiny delicate lavender flowers.

Verbena

Verbena hybrida

Small, five-petaled flowers in clusters of bouquets. Pink, red, purple, some with white eyes. Woody, creeping plant

Vinca rosea

Catharanthus

Glossy green leaves with phlox-like flowers of pink, red, white, and purple sometimes with eyes

Zinnia

Zinnia

Tall colorful round flowers that multiply and re-seed easily
